I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 3:05 p.m. by Dr. Wilson.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

IV. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Student Drop off Areas and Parking—Steve Selby, Director of Public Safety, addressed the Senate to gain feedback regarding student drop off areas. The campus needs another parking structure. Discussion ensued. Dr. Wilson asked that Senators email their suggestions to Mr. Selby.

Dia de Los Muertos—Chris Lamm announced the celebration of the Mexican day of the dead holiday in our quad on October 28, from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m.

V. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS

President's Report

Raffle Tickets—Dr. Wilson urged Senators to buy Ford Mustang tickets and matched the first ten.

Senate Attendance—Dr. Wilson reminded Senators that they will be removed on the third absence.

Priority registration—Cypress College has identified both faculty and managers to serve on this work group. We are sending Dale Craig and Dana Clahane.

State Budget—Dr. Wilson announced that the state budget has been approved. He requested that Senators who would like a copy contact him. He also had a handout on construction overruns. In addition, he gave information on the general fund.

Treasurer's Report—The Senate has \$3,890 and approximately \$1000 for the curriculum institute. Seven hundred dollars will be used for the State Plenary Session.

VI. CURRICULUM COMMITTEE REPORT

Dr. Combs reported that the Curriculum Committee is working overtime to get proposals approved and ready for DCCC so they stay on track for the fall 2011 catalog.

The Curriculum Committee members are wrapping up a "fast track" proposal that will allow them to add 21-27 courses to the FC AA/AS GE pattern that were already approved for CSU GE but were missing from our Associate's Degree GE. This will be effective fall 2011.

Anyone interested in more information about the majors being developed by CCC and CSU faculty for SB 1440 transfer degrees may use available list serves.

Senators were asked to remind their divisions that 50 percent of the courses/programs up for six-year review in 2010-2011 should be pre-launched by November 1 with the rest by the first week of spring semester. They should check in their division Curriculum Committee representatives if they have questions about six-year review.

As a last reminder, any new courses or major revisions intended for fall 2012 should be pre-launched by February 1, 2011. This deadline is posted on the curriculum master calendar in CurricUNET.

VIII. OLD BUSINESS

Technology Plan—The macro plan for regular upgrades of PCs and infrastructure is being developed by ITC and the TIPC.

District Directives on Scheduling—United Faculty takes the position that the Deans have the right of assignment. Discussion ensued. Dr. Wilson will try to schedule Vice Chancellor Horsley to speak to the Senate about the four-day workweek for faculty. The Senators, in general, wanted to know who developed this four-day workweek idea and why. Dr. Wilson asked the Senators to gather information for a list of “extra contract” items that faculty do besides be on campus so that

he can put together a list from the emails. Faculty are concerned that a directive mandating a four day work week as well as a limit to overload will adversely affect many programs and professional activities.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

Class Repetition—Consistent feedback from faculty members shows that they feel intervention is more important than more repetitions.

Online Tests—Feedback reveals that we need online testing rooms that will hold at least 55 students. Seating arrangements are a concern to prevent cheating.

X. LIAISON REPORTS

Associated Students—The AS Senate is full now. The blood drive has been completed already.

United Faculty—UF is still negotiating for a 16-week calendar. A District proposal was to make Saturday a duty day. The UF PAC has gotten resources from CTA and is running a television ad.

Adjunct Faculty United—No report.

Accreditation Self-Study—No report.
