

DCC Priority Registration Proposal
 RECOMMENDATION 05-25-2012, Revised 10-23-2012

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The purpose of this policy is to establish enrollment priority within the NOCCCD that is in accord with all applicable statutes and regulations. For purposes of this policy, unit limitations in all cases apply to the cumulative academic record for all enrollments at colleges within the District. Enrollment priority in Tiers 1 through 9 shall be lost if a student has earned one hundred (100) or more units at the district except for those students enrolled in high unit majors as defined in 2.1 of this policy.

Registration priority, in the order of priority listed below, shall be provided to students who are:

TIER 1	Eligible as a member of the armed forces or a veteran pursuant to Education Code section 66025.8 or as a foster youth or former foster youth pursuant to Education Code section 66025.9 who have completed orientation, assessment, and developed student education plans;
TIER 2	Eligible and receiving services through Disabled Student Program and Services or Extended Opportunity Program and Services who have completed orientation, assessment, and developed student education plans;
TIER 3	Members of intercollegiate athletics teams in good standing at colleges of the District.
TIER 4	Continuing students in good standing with fewer than 100 units who have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher with grades of A, B, C, or P in 75% or more of attempted units; (See also section 2.1 of this policy.)
TIER 5	Fully matriculated new students with priority assigned by date of application;
TIER 6	Continuing students in good standing with fewer than 100 units who have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher with grades of A, B, C, or P in 62.5% - 74.9% of attempted units; (See also section 2.1 of this policy.)
TIER 7	Continuing students in good standing with fewer than 100 units who have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher with grades of A, B, C, or P in 50% - 62.4% of attempted units; (See also section 2.1 of this policy.)
TIER 8	All other new students;
TIER 9	Continuing students with cumulative GPA less than 2.0 or on either Academic or Progress Probation;
TIER 10	Students who have earned one hundred (100) or more units at the district. For purposes of this provision a unit is earned when a student receives an evaluative symbol as pursuant to Title 5 section 55023 of. The 100-unit limit does not include units for English as a Second Language courses or non-degree applicable basic skills courses as defined in Title 5 section 55000(j) or special classes as defined in Title 5 section 55000.
TIER 11	Special admits.

2.0	<p>"High Unit Majors" are those that require more than 60 units for the completion of degree requirements.</p>
	<p>The curriculum committees of the colleges in the District shall determine which of our academic programs constitute "High Unit Majors". This determination shall also establish the number of units above 60 required for completion of the degree.</p>
	<p>For any student enrolled in a "High Unit Major" program of study, the 100 unit limit shall be increased by the number of units above 60 required for completion of the degree before loss of priority registration would occur.</p>

3.0	In accord with Title 5, Section 58108 (n), the colleges of the District shall review all requests for appeal of loss of priority registration in accord with local procedures established for petitions review in general. Prior to a final decision to uphold or deny the appeal, the Registrars of the sites shall consult to address any cross-campus issues related to the appeal. Subsequent to consultation, the decision of the Registrar from the site of appeal shall be final.
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4.0	In accord with state regulations, beginning in the spring 2013 term, the District shall enforce procedures to assure that students on academic or progress probation, or who have earned 75% or more of the unit limit, are notified that a second consecutive term on probation will result in the loss of priority registration or that enrollment priority will be lost when the student reaches the unit limit.
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5.0	For purposes of this policy, a new student is defined to be a student who has either;
	a) never before attended classes at colleges in the District, or;
	b) is a returning student who has not taken classes at colleges in the District in the last five (5) years.
