I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 3:03P by Kim Orlijan.

II. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

M/S/U (Cadena/Rosen) to add “Change structure of interim dean hiring committee” as the first item under New Business.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

The Senate approved the 15-Apr minutes.

IV. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Kelly Nelson-Wright, on behalf of some Social Sciences faculty, asked that the deadline to turn in final grades be extended.

Amber Gonzalez read the Fullerton College's Department of Ethnic Studies Statement Against Anti-Asian Violence (senators were emailed the full statement with links to resources).

Arnetta Smith shared her support for the AS Ethnic Studies resolution and frustration that it was not allowed to be presented at this Faculty Senate meeting.

Ziza Delgado expressed her solidarity with AS and her support of both the Multicultural and Ethnic Studies graduation requirements.

Bryana Zapatka shared her support for the AS Ethnic Studies resolution.

Erin Lacorte, on behalf of Logan Ueno, shared a statement of congratulations for Jodi Balma being selected as Faculty of the Year and support for the AS Ethnic Studies resolution.

Liz Sanchez shared her support for AS and both the Ethnic Studies and LGBTQIA+ resolutions.

Stephanie Rodriguez shared support for the AS resolutions and announced that Jodi Balma is a finalist for Orange County Teacher of the Year.

Aline Gregorio stated that AS resolutions had been shared at PAC and expressed her support for AS.

V. REPORT FROM FULLERTON COLLEGE PRESIDENT, DR. SCHULZ

Dr. Schulz stated that at the 27-Apr BoT meeting he shared highlights from the Fullerton College Magazine and Institutional Effectiveness Report.

He announced that the Dean of Natural Sciences, Richard Hartman, has announced his retirement. Recruitment will take place to hire an interim dean to start 1-July.

He informed the Senate that Jodi Balma is a finalist for the Orange County Teacher of the Year.

President's Report

ASCCC Spring Plenary

- From April 15-17, Kim attended the Academic Senate for Community Colleges Spring Plenary. Several resolutions were adopted at the event. Many of them connected to diversity, equity, and antiracism efforts as well as curriculum issues, especially around Ethnic Studies. Please check them out when you have a moment.

Items of Note from the Institutional Effectiveness Coordinating Council Meeting, 4/19/21:

- Initial results of the pilot withdrawal survey (recall that FC launched this pilot for students withdrawing from courses to learn about their reasons for

withdrawing) are being gathered by the Office of Institutional Effectiveness. So far, there are over 8,000 responses.

Items of Note from the Planning and Budget Steering Committee Meeting, 4/21/21:

- VP Garcia reported that FC has disbursed over \$4.8 million to our students. We are in process to disburse another \$500 to over 9,000 students at the end of this month--close to another 5 million. FC is considering an increase to \$1,000 or more for each student disbursement in fall. These funds are from the Federal Government and the three rounds of CARES (Coronavirus Economic Relief and Economic Security) Act funding.

Curriculum Chair's Report, John Ison

John Ison shared that the AS Ethnic Studies Resolution will be presented at the 5-May Curriculum Committee meeting. He discussed the efforts by the committee to work with Ethnic Studies faculty, fast track courses and update catalog descriptions. He also clarified that it is a two-year process for courses to be first UC approved then IGETC approved, and the target prelaunch date is 1-Oct.
