I. CALL TO ORDER

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V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Danielle Fouquette shared her support for Bridget Kominek to serve as Faculty Senate Treasurer.

Erin Lacorte shared concerns regarding problematic language in BP/AP 7600 Campus Safety Officers.

Karen Markley expressed concern that the Chancellor and Board of Trustees rejected all final candidates for Fullerton College President. She stated that it was problematic for them to reject an exceptional candidate, Dr. Gil Contreras.

Aline Gregorio discussed the upcoming Earth Day Symposium and shared her support for Roman de Jesus to be elected to the Sustainability Committee.

Naveen Kanal expressed concern regarding the categories for Students of Distinction and that adjunct faculty cannot serve on the Faculty Senate Exec.

Roman de Jesus shared reasons why he would like to serve on the Sustainability Committee.

Mohammad Abdel Haq shared concerns about the language in BP/AP 7600. Paloma Foster shared reasons why she thinks the language in BP/AP 7600 needs to be revised.

Jodi Balma congratulated Paloma Foster on being elected as the FC Student Trustee.

Tina Cruz shared concerns with the language in BP/AP 7600.

MEETING REPORTS

Items of Note from President's Advisory Council (PAC) Meeting, 4/13/22

- PBSC reported to PAC that we will continue to provide at least one free meal to students in summer and fall 2022.
- PAC voted to support the Guided Pathways proposals recently endorsed by Faculty Senate including:

New Program Map Design Principles
Creation of the Program Map Advisory Group

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New Orientation Videos for Onboarding New Students

Pathways Steering Committee New Mission, Purpose and Membership

 PAC approved proposed application for the NSA National Centers of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense, Cyber Research, and/or Cyber Operations (NCAE-C) grant.

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Items of Note from the Board of Trustees Meeting, 4/12/22:

- The BoT approved the Tentative Agreement negotiated between United Faculty and the District and ratified by the faculty (please see email from our UF President Christie Diep fand review the attachments for all the details).
- The BoT approved Fullerton College Curriculum Changes effective 2022 and 2023, including five new courses in American Sign Language (ASL).
- The BoT authorized Fullerton College to enter into an agreement with the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office to accept California Apprenticeship Initiative funds for the Drone Pilot Apprenticeship Program.
- The BoT discussed the following bills introduced by state legislators this year that focus on further amending the Brown Act's traditional teleconferencing rules, as well as updating the structure and protocols of open meetings:
 - SB 1100, by former county supervisor Senator Dave Cortese, deals with behavior at Brown Act meetings. The bill would clarify the rules around when individuals can be removed for willfully interrupting a meeting. The bill would require a warning to be issued before removal in most cases and would apply to behavior "that substantially impairs or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting in accordance with law," including failure to comply reasonable meeting rules adopted by the legislative body.
 - AB 1944, by Assembly Members Alex Lee and Cristina Garcia, would allow public officials to attend Brown Act meetings remotely without being required to publish their address or open their remote location to members of the public. In order to take advantage of this flexibility, legislative bodies would need to provide a publicly accessible live video stream of the meeting online and a way for members of the public to provide public comment remotely, either by phone or audio-visual means.
 - AB 2449, by Assembly Member Blanca Rubio, would also allow local officials to attend meetings remotely, though under slightly different conditions. This bill would require at least a quorum of the legislative body to attend in person at the primary location and for all remote members to participate by both audio and visual technology. It would also require the public to be able to provide public comment remotely, either by phone or an internet-based option and it clarifies that there must be a procedure for resolving requests for reasonable accommodation for individuals with disabilities.
 - AB 2647, by Assembly Member Marc Levine would give local agencies more flexibility to make documents provided to governing board members available to the public online when they're distributed outside of standard business hours.

Items of Note from the Council on Budget and Finance (CBF) Meeting, 4/11/22

- CBF discussions centered around increasing enrollment.
- Faculty Rep Rodriguez emphasized the importance of investing in infrastructure in preparation for return to campus.
- Chancellor Williams stated a goal of 23,500 FTES and asked what we can do in our instructional programs to increase enrollment. He explained that the 20% reduction from the drop in enrollment translates into a 20% reduction in staffing, so the money is not there to add additional positions unless we increase enrollment.
- CBF discussed the contributions of Guided Pathways, and the possibility of livestreaming classes so that students could participate in person or remotely.

Items of note from the District Coordinating Council (DCC) Next meeting 4/25/22

Items of note from the PBSC meeting -4/6/22:

(Meeting scheduled for 4/20/22 was cancelled)

- At PBSC, Daniel Berumen (OIR) reported that at the district level there is work going on with a third-party vendor to get a survey out at the end of the term that connects how students want to learn and how faculty want to work.
- The PBSC Faculty Reps (Wilson, Rodriguez) initiated discussions about fall
 planning and expressed concerns about planning and preparedness to
 ensure support services are in place that were available prior to the
 pandemic (ACT support during classes, lab testing and preparation in
 advance of classes starting, Zoom or livestream capability for instruction,
 etc.). They asked where/when faculty would have the opportunity for
 input into fall planning and preparation to help ensure faculty have what
 they need when they return to teaching on campus.
- VP Rod Garcia reported that we have scheduled maintenance funds of 6.4 million dollars this year and has proposed the following projects:
 - Boiler repair, Renovate 840 bathroom, Re-roof 1000 building, 1300 building fly tower repairs (theatre), Turf field replacement, ADA modifications phase 1, Wilshire hot water piping replacement, Utility tunnel repairs phase 2, Berkeley center paving repairs and ADA modifications, Re-Roof NOCE, EMS Controller upgrades, Electric Meter Install Project
- VP Rod Garcia confirmed there would be sufficient parking for faculty and staff in the fall

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M/S/U (Markley/Wilson) to endorse the recommendation of the Senate Exec to choose Dr. Contreras as the "Administrator of the Year."

Curriculum Chair Report, John Ison

John Ison informed senators that faculty should plan courses and programs over the summer for an effective Fall 2024 catalog date. The UC transfer/IGETC prelaunch deadline is 1-Oct, 22; courses that require re/articulation should enter the approval process by 1-Oct.

The union is forming an Extensive Lab Committee, consisting of various district representatives, including one FC curriculum member and one Senator, in order to discuss and plan the newly-ratified agreement to lecture/lab parity.

If faculty are developing certificates that could lead to a vocation, please check carefully to make sure that your TOP code is CTE. Kenneth Starkman in Tech and Engineering can provide advice as you navigate the process of applying for CTE approval.

The planned rescheduling of Fall registration, effective 2025 or so, is taking once-a-year articulation deadlines into consideration. Faculty should continue to plan two to three years in advance for university-transfer-level courses and programs.

He also reported that there will be many new curriculum representatives starting in fall, and he is always available to answer questions and provide assistance.

Kennedy DeVries shared that AS held elections this week. She shared the AS Statement in Support of the Free Hot Meal Program and Fullerton College. She also shared information about the events taking place during Student Engagement Week.
